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					Students will explore key themes and turning points in American history through the lens of the Marvel Cinematic Universe. Using superheroes as the cultural mirror, we will investigate how Marvel stories reflect and reshape real-world events, including wars, civil rights struggles, political power, and national identity. Weekly class sessions will include discussions, hands-on activities, and collaborative projects, all anchored in a bi-weekly viewing of a selected Marvel movie or episode for homework. Students will also participate in a weekly Bible devotion that connects a theme from the week's Marvel story or historical event to a Biblical principle—such as justice, courage, sacrifice, or redemption—helping students see how faith intersects with both history and modern storytelling. From Captain America's origins in WWII to Black Panther's vision of leadership and legacy, students will compare Marvel narratives with historical moments to better understand the American experience.
